**Resolution 262 (1968)  
of 31 December 1968**

*The Security Council,*  
*Having considered* the agenda contained in document S/Agenda/1462,  
*Having noted* the contents of the letter of the Permanent Representative of Lebanon (S/8945),<sup>40</sup>  
*Having noted* the supplementary information pro-

vided by the Chief of Staff of the United Nations Truce Supervision Organization contained in documents S/7930/Add.107<sup>40</sup> and Add.108.<sup>40</sup>

*Having heard* the statements of the representative of Lebanon and of the representative of Israel concerning the grave attack committed against the civil International Airport of Beirut,

*Observing* that the military action by the armed forces of Israel against the civil International Airport of Beirut was premeditated and of a large scale and carefully planned nature,

*Gravely concerned* about the deteriorating situation resulting from this violation of the Security Council resolutions,

*Deeply concerned* about the need to assure free uninterrupted international civil air traffic,

1. *Condemns* Israel for its premeditated military action in violation of its obligations under the Charter and the cease-fire resolutions;

2. *Considers* that such premeditated acts of violence endanger the maintenance of the peace;

3. *Issues* a solemn warning to Israel that if such acts were to be repeated, the Council would have to consider further steps to give effect to its decisions;

4. *Considers* that Lebanon is entitled to appropriate redress for the destruction it has suffered, responsibility for which has been acknowledged by Israel.

*Adopted unanimously at the 1462nd meeting.*

LETTER DATED 17 JUNE 1974 FROM THE ACTING PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE  
OF LEBANON TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE  
SECURITY COUNCIL

On instructions from my Government, and further to our letter S/11298 of 17 May 1974, I have the honour to bring to your attention the continued acts of aggression committed by Israel against Lebanon.

Since 17 May 1974, Israeli military forces have daily overflowed Lebanon's air space, penetrated into Lebanese territories and shelled and bombed towns and villages in southern Lebanon in flagrant violation of the Lebanese-Israeli Armistice Agreement and the resolutions of the Security Council.

As a result of these attacks, 11 persons have been killed, including 3 children, 58 persons have been wounded and over 100 houses have been destroyed.

These Israeli barbaric assaults are aimed at terrorizing the civilian population in southern Lebanon and victimizing Lebanon for hosting 300,000 Palestinian refugees on its soil, whom Israel has evicted from their homeland and against whom Israel conducts a systematic policy of genocide and extermination in their exile.

The Israeli Government, for apparent Israeli political and domestic reasons, attempts to find in Lebanon a scapegoat for acts committed by Palestinians operating from within Israel. Lebanon cannot be held responsible for acts of violence occurring inside Israel and which Israel since its creation has set in motion by terror and bloodshed.

The Israeli Government is putting its head into the sand by refusing to face the real issue, namely the people of Palestine. The end of violence and bloodshed cannot be achieved by repeated Israeli attacks on Lebanon and on the Palestinian refugee camps which bring death, destruction and untold sufferings. Such repugnant policies and methods carried out by Israel have proven to be futile and self-defeating and have provoked the abhorrence and indignation of the world community.

It is time that the Government of Israel take the realistic and audacious step of recognizing and restoring the inalienable and legitimate rights of the Palestinian people according to the United Nations resolutions and the principles of justice and morality, for only then, will a lasting peace be achieved in the Middle East.
